CATEGORIES:

- 7th to 8th grade: \$35 prize and \$20 prize decided by judges' panel
- 9th to 12th grade: \$35 prize and \$20 prize decided by judges' panel
- Adult: \$35 prize and \$20 prize decided by judges' panel
- People's Choice: \$50 Award decided by fair attendees
- Recycled Competition by local businesses: Certificate Awards decided by judges' panel (tire sculptures, etc.)

DETAILS

Recycled Sculpture Contest 2012

In celebration of Earth Day, the Portneuf Valley Environmental Fair will host a recyclable art sculpture contest on April 21, 2012. The contest will raise awareness among students, adults, and their communities about the need for recycling and emphasize what materials are recyclable locally.

Guidelines

- 1) Open to Junior High to 100 years of age.
- 2) Contest entries should be planned around the theme “Rethink, Reuse, Recycle.”
- 3) Use only locally recyclable materials for creating the art sculpture.
- 4) All entries will be displayed during the Portneuf Valley Environmental Fair on April 21, 2012. Entries shall be brought to Optimist Park between 9:30 a.m. and 10 a.m. Sculptors shall complete an entry form and place their sculpture in the display area.
- 5) Celebration attendees may vote throughout the day for one sculpture using the “Voting Ticket” received when entering the fair. A judges' panel will decide winners based on criteria for age categories and business competitions.
- 6) The People's Choice award will be presented to the sculpture receiving the greatest number of votes by fair attendees. Votes will be counted at 2 p.m. The judges will announce winners before 3:00 pm.
- 7) Sculptors will collect and remove their sculptures from Optimist Park between 3 p.m. and 3:30 p.m.

Judging Criteria

- Number of Recyclable Categories used (i.e., wood, paper, plastic, metals — **Glass and duct tape are NOT permitted.**)
- Percent of sculpture made from recycled materials
- Originality (Sculpture can be realistic or abstract)
- Design and artistic impact (WOW factor)
- Complexity of sculpture
